ACE is the stunning 44.5-meter bespoke vessel built by Conrad Shipyard. She can be considered the new flagship of Poland as she is the largest motoryacht ever built in the nation. The accuracy and elegance of her refined and richly detailed bespoke interiors are the work of Milan-based studio M2 Atelier.

The latest ACE of Poland

The largest motoryacht ever built in Poland debuts, targeting a truly prestigious destination. Her name is ACE and she can be considered the new flagship of the nation. She is the result of the exacting efforts of the Conrad Shipyard: builders, at their Gdansk facilities, of this superb and stunning 44.5-meter bespoke vessel.

Her volumes of just under 500 GT (494GT) are the expression of a great project achieved in just two years, representing the first unit in the C144s line.

ACE boasts a steel hull and aluminium superstructure with a max. beam of 8.90 m (29 ft 2 in), spanning four decks.


The yacht's exteriors were drawn up by the creative pen of Britain's Reymond Langton and team, whose decades of experience and incredible attention to detail led to the graceful, sporty and dynamic lines, completed with the decisive collaboration with Diana Yacht Design, who developed the naval architecture and engineering.

The accuracy and elegance of her refined and richly detailed bespoke interiors are the work of Milan-based

studio M2 Atelier, also the creators of the outdoor elements, guaranteeing a unique experience for the 10 on-board guests, who can find comfortable accommodations in the five beautifully appointed on-board suites. Winning absolute approval is the master suite dedicated to the owner, who can enjoy a generous and bright space forward of the main deck; as well as the two VIP cabins and two guest cabins positioned in the middle of the lower deck.

From the bridge deck and its wheelhouse, the captain can manage shipboard operations and navigation and coordinate the 9-member crew, operating on the lower deck. The sun deck is truly a pleasant surprise, generous in space and well organised with a pleasurable Jacuzzi, perfect for enjoying the sea breezes. ACE's thrust is generated by two powerful CAT engines, allowing her to reach top speeds of 13 knots and a cruising speed of 10 knots in optimal weather conditions, for a distance of as much as 4,000 nautical miles, making her extremely autonomous, and also stable with her electric zero speed stabilizers.





Mikołaj Król, Chairman and CEO describes the exciting experience matured with ACE: "This project is a combination of a stylish design with incredible harmony, but also the intriguing silhouette of a modern superyacht. Thanks to the impeccable collaboration with all the people involved in the project, we achieved collective success."

Words that reflect the philosophy of a young shipyard founded in 2003 but already boasting considerable experience, and the pedigree to tackle not only new units of C144S, but also the production of luxury sailing and motor superyachts of up to 100 metres. In addition, the strategic location in one of the most historic shipbuilding cities in Northern Europe allows this shipyard it to exploit the potential of the local nautical district, and carry out important sailing tests in the intrepid Baltic Sea.

Soon ACE will sail to warmer seas, and certainly gain recognition for her thoroughness. While waiting to admire her we can lose ourselves in reading one of the exotic novels written by the Polish-British navigator and writer Joseph Conrad, the true inspi-

ration for this shipyard's name. Stay tuned!
